School Council Principal's Report

January 2022

• COVID Update:

- We have had a few positive cases connected with our school. When a positive case is reported by a parent or guardian, we share that information with Palliser and send out a notification to the families of the students in that grade or homeroom group.
- Families will be receiving medical-grade masks and rapid test kits for each student. Should a student test positive using the rapid tests, parents are asked to contact the school. We will track positive cases and absenteeism and will share this with Palliser.
- Updated stay at home guidelines will be sent home to families for their reference, as well as a reminder to have students complete the AHS Daily Health Checklist each day before coming to school.
- A free online tutoring program for students in junior high was mentioned in today's COVID update. I will send out information and details to families directly.

• January Exams:

- Diploma exams have been cancelled.
- PATs have not been cancelled, but delayed.
- Staff have been asked to develop in-class final assessments for students. We are meeting Friday morning to discuss how we will manage final assessments:
 - Our challenge is that we need to be prepared to assess students in person or online, and we need to take into account learning loss, particularly the loss of this week's classes, as well as student mental health. However, the feedback from students last year was that they would have preferred an exam over the final projects that were offered, and there is anxiety about not experiencing a high-stakes exam scenario during their high school careers.
 - We will look at condensing the exam period to allow for more in-class time in January, and will limit final assessments to a maximum of 10% of a student's final grade.
 - We will explore the possibility of offering non-jeopardy assessments, cumulative projects, a series of unit review exams, and other options that will be beneficial to our students.
- What would parents like to see?

• Athletics:

- Basketball seasons are underway. We've had an excellent turnout for both senior high and junior high teams.
- Spectators will not be permitted at home games for the time being.
- CCHS appreciates all of the time and energy invested by our volunteer coaches and managers.

• Annual Report:

 Our Annual Education Report is available for your perusal and feedback. This is a living document, and as such, can be changed or modified as we go along based on feedback, ideas, progress made, or new priorities that arise. The report is located on the school's website under "Documents."

• Awards:

- We are looking at possible changes to the student recognition program at CCHS. We would like to move our annual awards ceremony to the spring, rather than the following fall.

• Teacher Wish Lists:

- Teachers have been asked to compile a list of needs and wants for their individual classrooms as well as the school in general, focusing on ways to improve student learning and engagement.
- Initial requests include: a class set of Chromebooks specifically for the junior high ELA classroom; more rocking chairs and exercise balls for student seating; new digital microscopes for the science lab; and a new fridge for the foods lab. An itemized list with costs will be presented to School Council in February.

• Making Connections Worker:

• We have a new Making Connections Worker. Auburn Phillips started in December and will be providing students with universal, targeted, and individualized supports. Her main purpose will be to connect with students and their families, particularly those who are struggling with attendance or challenges in the home, but she will also be offering help with the implementation of our 4th R curriculum, providing classroom workshops around anxiety and mental health, and working with specific grades and small groups to help students develop social skills, create friendship groups, and transition from feeder schools. She will also help families connect with external resources as needed.
