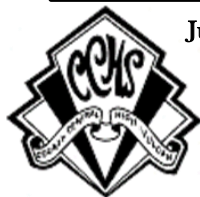

7 Things to think about the Night before an Exam

1. **Positive Imagery:** Spend some time visualizing a positive exam experience. This will increase your confidence, help with nerves and enhance your mood.
2. **Your Best Performance:** Think about a previous good performance. What helped you do well that time and how you will apply that tomorrow?
3. **Your Preparation:** Boost your confidence by reminding yourself of how well you have prepared and how much revision you have done.
4. **Focus on You:** Focus on yourself and don't compare yourself to others as this will make you feel stressed. Instead, focus on what you can control.
5. **The Challenge:** If you see the exam as a threat, it will make you stressed. View the exam as an opportunity or as a challenge. This will make you feel better.
6. **Overcoming Setbacks:** Remind yourself how you overcame previous setbacks. This will help you deal with future challenges and build mental resilience.
7. **A Good Night's Sleep:** A good night's sleep helps improve creativity, problem solving, concentration and memory. This is more important than last minute cramming.

Grade 11 Merit Award: students can apply for the University of Lethbridge Grade 11 Merit Scholarships, which entitles students with a 75 - 79.9% average with \$500 towards U of L tuition and those students with an 80% or above average a total of \$800 towards U of L tuition once they've graduated. Students are encouraged to apply early. Students in other schools have already been notified of their award amount; however, they do have until **JUNE 30**. myPass: Make sure your Grade 12 student is signed up with myPass in order to receive his/her diploma marks in July. Students can begin signing up for myPass in Grade 10. myPass provides information on credits, keeps track of where you are towards your high school diploma, allows you to order official transcripts and so on. STUDENT LOANS

Student Loan applications for students studying in the fall of 2019 will be available online in late June. Visit <http://studentaid.alberta.ca/> to apply. Students WILL NEED their Alberta Student Number, which is on their transcripts on the top right-hand side (ASN) as well as their Social Insurance Number.
