BOARD REPORT - ROBERT STRAUSS

Highlights of Board of Trustees Meeting Tues, December 15, 2020

Early Learning: Early Learning Coordinator Margaret Vennard and Director of Learning Shane Cranston shared the Early Learning Report. New for 2020 – 2021 is that Alberta Education has changed the funding and

kindergarten students are no longer part of the Early Learning program. Kindergarten programming is now part of Specialized Learning Supports budget and provides consistent support throughout a student's entire Kindergarten to Grade 2 experience. Palliser School Division has an amazing team of Early Language Educators. The Early Learning Educators have done a very good job in helping young students adjust to school during a pandemic. Their COVID practices include more outdoor play, cleaning routines, and, individual kits/ toys.

International Students: COVID-19 has put a damper on international student entry in Alberta. Deputy Superintendent Tom Hamer shared the impact that the virus had on international studies in Palliser. While enrolment numbers decreased from the previous year, there has been more interest for fall 2021 and beyond. When the world opens up for international travel, it is expected to see higher enrolment numbers in the coming years as the world starts to recover from the pandemic.

Policy Update: The Trustees approved Policy 23 – Policy Making and Policy 1– Role of the Board of Trustees. The updated policies will be posted to the Division website and shared with all staff. Draft Policy 4 – Trustee Protocol and Draft Policy 11– Appeals and Hearings Regarding Student Matters were reviewed. The draft policies will be posted to the Palliser website and shared with stakeholders for input. For input into the policies go to https://www.pallisersd.ab.ca/board-of-trustees/policy-review.

2021-2022 Calendar: Associate Superintendent of HR, Audrey Kluin shared the proposed 2021-2022 calendar with the Board. The proposed calendar is in line with the calendars of the divisions that surround Palliser and that is an advantage to families who work in different geographic areas. The first day for students will be September 1, 2021 and their final day will be June 28, 2021 Individual schools will now begin finalizing their calendars in consultation with the school councils and staff.

PRINCIPAL REPORT - LEANNE HELLMAN

THANK YOU! On behalf of the staff of CCHS, thank you so much for the cards and Christmas wishes shared by School Council. We are also grateful to the many families who dropped off goodies for staff - we enjoyed every bit of it, and it helped get us through a difficult few weeks.

Graduation: We have ordered grad hoodies and have completed grad photos. Next, we will be collecting sizing information for caps and gowns and will be ordering diplomas and covers.

Awards: All scholarships have been handed out - students were invited to come to the school to pick up their cheques and certificates and had their photos taken.

Final Exams: CCHS staff is working under the guidelines recently provided by Palliser and plans will be finalized by Friday. The guidelines - out of respect for the extraordinary circumstances and student stress levels - ask that we find alternative ways of completing end-of-semester assessments. These assessments will take place between January 11th - 22nd and will consist of final projects, written assessments, and reviews of previous units.

New Staff Member: Farley! Farley will be at the school most days and is starting his training this weekend.

Foods Lab: We are in the process of updating equipment: 4 new stoves, new mixers, blenders, and microwaves, new cookware, bakeware, and utensils. These items are being provided out of a private donation of \$5000.00 to the school for this purpose.

Athletics: There are no sports running at this time. We are monitoring the cases in Alberta and in Vulcan County. We will work with Palliser to determine if and when sports can return.

Accountability Pillar Survey: Our annual survey will be taking place at the end of January. I would like members to think about how we can work together to improve parent engagement and participation
