CHAT

CHAT stands for Community, Homework, and Tutorial

- 45 minutes each day
 - Homework, studying, and group projects
 - Seeing teachers for extra help
 - Classroom presentations, assemblies, and events
 - Building community and fostering positive relationships

How is High School Different?

- Courses are Semestered
 - Semesters run from September January and from February June
 - 2 core subjects in Semester I & 2 core subjects in Semester II
 - Quicker pace, classes every day, less time to catch up if you fall behind
- Courses Count for <u>Credits</u>
 - Full course (core) = 5 credits
 - Half course (option) = 3 credits
 - Graduation = 100 credits by the end of Grade 12
- Courses Must Be Completed
 - You must pass a course and receive credits before being allowed to move to the next course
 - Grade 10 = 10, Grade 11 = 20, & Grade 12 = 30

High School Diploma Requirements

- → 100 credits
- → 20-level Math & Science
- → 30-level English & Social
- → CALM & PE 10
- → 10 credits for Fine Arts, CTS, Work Experience, etc.
- → 10 credits at the 30-level (other than English & Social)
